Prosper and JTC Furniture have formed an 'industry-first' partnership with eight members of the North East Housing Partnership (NEHP), facilitated by Prosper and the Northern Housing Consortium, to collaborate across the sector to supply and distribute kitchens, potentially saving North East registered social landlords up to £10 million savings over the next ten years.

It shows how a shared procurement approach can unlock significant efficiencies while maintaining high standards across multiple organisations.

It's a clear example of how working together can deliver better outcomes, not just for organisations, but for residents too. The Northern Housing Consortium provide the secretariat support for the North East Housing Partnership and have worked closely with Prosper to engage with Landlord Partners to outline and build the principles of collaboration. JTC is an approved delivery partner on Prosper's Kitchen Supply & Distribution framework, after securing a place on all seven regional lots.

The partnership was initiated by Gentoo and Karbon Homes, who both had pre-existing contracts with JTC Furniture.

The benefits were then discussed with NEHP members, with believe housing, Bernicia, Thirteen Group, North Star Housing, North Tyneside Council and Railway Housing joining the collaboration.

This groundbreaking new project will not only bring economic, social and environmental benefits to the region, it could save landlord partners and local authorities millions in their planned investment programmes, including approximately 5,000 kitchens next year alone.

Prosper completed a full review of the end-to-end process with JTC and landlord partners, which ensured all aspects of valuation creation were identified with the full supply chain engaged. Following this, a business case was prepared and presented to members of the North East

Housing Partnership (NEHP), a group of North East-based housing associations and stock owning local authorities.

All eight housing providers have agreed to align to a standard specification of kitchen, delivering the same level of quality for residents, but that could equate to cost savings of £7.5m over the next ten years.

The offer, prioritising local supply chains where possible, will cover planned investment works, void solutions, R&M solutions and new build solutions including homes for rent, shared ownership properties and homes for sale including a supply and install option.

In addition to offering social landlords efficiency, flexibility and cost savings, the wider collaboration will also see improved sustainability, reductions in waste management, added social value and the creation of jobs for local people including social housing residents.





Regional distribution and assembly centre

To support the partnership, JTC has expanded its regional hub in the North East by securing a 10-year lease on a new 10,000 sq. ft. regional assembly and distribution centre based in Cramlington, Northumberland, which will hold stock of kitchen units. The facility will also enable local assembly of the units providing faster delivery times and reducing its carbon footprint through reduced transportation.



Local employment secured

The collaboration will create pathways into employment for social housing residents with JTC working in partnership with NEHP members' employability teams. Based on current commitments, the partnership has already created **eight** employment opportunities within JTC, including the appointment of trainee warehouse operatives, a general manager and three surveyors. They are currently advertising another surveyor role with a further **seven** roles forecast to be created as the partnership scales up volume.

The collaboration also reduces JTC's current carbon footprint and the new distribution hub means they can redirect operations from their new facility in Cramlington. This includes shipping kitchen carcass components, door fronts and worktops delivered in agreed cut sizes all to the North East.

It's expected participating NEHP members will also save up to £2.5m in waste disposal costs from end-of-life kitchens being recycled over the next ten years.

A new sustainability and waste management initiative will see wood waste segregated and collected from site by Timberpak, part of Egger. Egger manufactures carcass and door front boards typically from raw timber but this is now in short supply due to government-subsidised biomass energy plants buying significant amounts of raw timber. The waste will be collected in Timberpak skips which are more economical than general waste skips and is somewhere landlords can dispose of their wood waste saving them money and creating a circular economy.

JTC supports landlord partners through Prosper's Social Value Dividend Fund, with over £1 million of social value expected to be generated from this collaboration.

JTC will support regionwide social value initiatives by members of the NEHP and a skills and training programme will be created in the North East. Karbon, Gentoo and Bernicia's Employability Teams will seek to employ local people.

The project was launched in April 2026 and is just one example of a multiple Collaborative Framework model offered by Prosper and its partners.

Also, other NEHP members can join the partnership at any time in the future.”
